Pre- Occupational Therapy Curriculum

ACOTE, the governing body for Occupational Therapy has advised that beginning July 1, 2027, all entry-level OT positions will require a doctoral degree. SIU no longer recommends the masters track and encourages students to pursue Doctorate of Occupational Therapy (OTD) degrees.

Pre-occupational therapy is not a major. The student must choose a major in which to earn a baccalaureate degree. This major must be declared by the end of the freshman year. Transfer students must declare a major by the beginning of their second semester following transfer. Typical majors for pre-occupational therapy include Biological Sciences or Physiology, Psychology, Education, Exercise Science, and Therapeutic Recreation.

Minimum & Recommended Coursework for Illinois Schools

Bolded courses meet the <u>minimum</u> school requirements. Students are strongly recommended also to meet the recommended course requirements. Prerequisite courses must transfer with a B or better. Students must have earned a baccalaureate degree¹ with a minimum GPA of 2.75/4.0 for master's programs and 3.0/4.0 for doctoral programs. Some programs have higher GPA requirements. *DISCLAIMER*: <u>Pre-requisites are listed as quidelines only</u>. Students should contact the Office of Admissions of any schools to which they intend to apply to determine the exact science coursework required.

Most programs require the GRE, and a minimum of 40 hours of human service/occupational therapy relevant experience. We recommend these experiences be in different practice settings. It is a good idea to log your hours, activities, and personal reactions.

Doctoral Programs in Occupational Therapy

In Illinois: Southern Illinois University (DOT only), Elmhurst State, Governor's State University, University of Illinois at Chicago, Midwestern University and Rush University. Regional programs include: University of Southern Indiana at Evansville, Rockhurst University, St. Louis University, and Washington University. University of Illinois Chicago has suspended admissions to its MOT program pending the development of its direct-entry DOT program. Governor's State University's DOT program is direct-entry only with a bachelor's of OT accredited by ACOTE. Otherwise, a Masters of OT or a current state occupational therapy license are required, in addition to other requirements. See Governor's State website for more information. Elmhurst University requires statistics (MATH 282 or equivalent). KIN 320 (Exercise Physiology) not accepted. Chicago State University requires Intro to Anthropology or Sociology, Statistics.
